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Description and information about a stay on OKAMBARA Elephant Lodge/Namibia

Namibia – Africa's Diamond

Everlasting sunshine and the experience of boundless distance – that's Namibia. Additionally, adventure and luxury on an exclusive Game Ranch in the middle of Namibia's Bush – that's OKAMBARA – the small Etosha Variant.

Activities

On the approx. 15.000 hectares of the Okambara-Resort you can watch elephants, rhinos, giraffes, hyenas, cheetahs, different antelopes, zebras and ostriches every day. We take you on photo-tours as well as safaris. At OKAMBARA you are at the pulse of nature.

Breathtaking hikes or nightwalks, barbecue evenings under the dark-blue shimmering sky assure an unforgettable vacation for the whole family.

Transfer, journey memo, Health & Care

From Windhoek International Airport, OKAMBARA is situated approx. 1 hour's drive in eastern direction. You will be picked up from the airport. Vaccinations are not necessary. At an altitude of 1500 m climatically very favorable, the farm lies not in the malaria area. According to the return-flight day, your passport should be valid 6 additional months at least. Western Europe citizens don't need any visa.

Due to Namibia's geographical location, it merely comes to a time lag of just one hour. A very pleasant journey is assured. Air Namibia serves Frankfurt-Windhoek- Frankfurt 4 times a week. The flight to Windhoek takes about 9.5 hours.

Namibia's road network is one of the best in Africa. Means of transportation, like airplane and train, are reliable and safe. The streets - the so-called "pads" - are permanently held and cared into stand. Therefore a safe and comfortable journey is assured.

Namibian summer begins in October and ends in April. Because of the exceptionally dry climate it is – even at greater heat - pleasant. Familiar temperatures in wintertime as well: between minus 6 at night till plus 20 degrees during the day.

No vaccinations are specified. Malaria prophylaxis is merely recommended for the north of the country during the summer months. The western European standard secures familiar conditions.

Tours

You can form your vacation individually. E.g. you spend some days on OKAMBARA with all activities as described on OKAMBARA.de. Thereafter you go on a longer or shorter guided or self-driving tour. Typically, tours last between 7 up to 24 days. Tours to Botswana, to the national parks of the Okavango-Delta, to the famous Victoria Falls in Zimbabwe or throughout South Africa can be carried out as well.

Highlights-Overview Namibia

Etoscha National Park

22270 km² big game reservation. Existent since 1907. Aprox. 140 different mammals like Rhinos, elephants, lions, cheetahs etc.

Beautifully loud and imposing: 340 bird kinds.

Overnight accommodations in the park: Fort Namutoni, Camp Okaukuejo and Camp Halali.

Vingerklip/Twyfelfontein

Here you find the Petrified Woods, a collection of fossil tree-trunks which are between 200 and 300 million years old;

the Finger Cliff, a 35 meters high free-standing rock formation;

more than 2500 rock-engravements and ancient rock paintings (6000 years old);

the Burnt Mountain with the so-called Organ Pipes (5 meters high basalt columns);

Skeleton Coast

Primarily because of his numerous ship wrecks, the skelton coast is a bizarre sight. The camps Terrace and Torra Bay are ideal starting points for an inspection. Cape Cross, with its worldwide largest seal colony, lies to the south. The estimates sway again and again. But at least 100000 seals live at this coast section.

Swakopmund

Swakopmund, Namibias vacation and spa at the Atlantic Ocean. Promenades, palm avenues, parks and a miles long Beach really cry out for relaxation, silence and diversion. The Art Nouveau town has a golf course and excellent hinge possibilities.

You can stay at the ORANGE House – the pleasant bed ' n breakfast pension (30,- € p.p. in a double-room). The ORANGE House lies approx. 1.5 km to the north of the famous "mole". On foot it isn't even 2 minutes to the beach.

Additionally, the youngest B ' n B in Swakopmund has a rooftop sunterrace with a wonderful seaview. The idyllic garden is directly attainable from each of the 5 double rooms.

Excursions: For instance Walfish Bay, Namibias seaport, Goanikontes Oasis or to Welwitschia Mirabilis, with its age of 1500 years an impressively old plant, exclusively found in Namibia.

....a little more action, please !

If you look for a little more action you are best kept in SWAKOP ! Climb the dunes of Swakop on a Quad-Bike Ride or roar down the dunes by Sandboard. Catch some adrenalin at Sky-Diving or, a little less thrilling but nevertheless unique, play a round of golf on the 18 hole desert-course of Rossmund Golf Club. Further activities: Seal- and dolphin watching, deep-sea fishing or scenic-flights e.g. to Sossusvlei

Namib-Naukluft Park

The most beautiful "nothing" of the world. Surrounded by mountains and desert, the 50000 km² Namib-Naukluft park is the worlds fourth largest nature reserve. The undisputed stars are the dunes of **Sossusvlei**. You will be astonished about this colourful dune-lightshow !

By wind-erosion rock particles are taken down from the Naukluft mountains and blown away to the desert. This fine rock dust mixes with the sand. The most different color shades arise, if sunlight is refracted in the rocky dust. Depending on light-intensity, the dunes therefore gleam in different facets of red to violette, of beige to orange. Indeed, a cheerful moment!

At the southern edge of the park you reach the small town of Lüderitz, where the first German settlers arrived in the middle of the 19th century. Close to Lüderitz, the diamond settlement Kolmanskoppe is situated. A deserted town. A ghost town. In any case not unthrilling and quite sure worth a visit.

The south

For sure you know the largest Canyon of the world, don't you ? Sure, Grand Canyon. But do you also know the second largest? Here's the answer: The Fish River Canyon is the second largest Canyon of the world. With its length of 160 km and a width up to 27 km this ravine is a force ! So, if you come along during your trip you should stop by here and make a canyon walk for instance. Exceptional, formidable.

Additional remark on the access of Fish River Canyon !

Due to acute water shortage within the hot summer months the canyon is closed. **Therefore, please inform yourself on time about canyon accessibility, e.g. at the OKAMBARA office in Frensdorf, Germany (0049.(0)9502.49090) or by e.mail (info@OKAMBARA.de).**

In the proximity of the Fish River Canyon: Keetmanshoop, "the capital of the south" as it is called here. Close to Keetmanshoop you find the Quiver Tree Forest, the only forest of the world under conservation. Simultaneously, the quiver tree is also Namibia's national symbol. The quiver tree, has neither sheets nor needles. And otherwise nothing grows on it, too. He is yellow colored and simply beautiful. The quiver tree forest: where trees merge with art.

Further towards the north, in the middle of nowhere, you come across this curiosity: Duwisib Castle. Once built by a German duke as a gift for his wife, nowadays Duwisib is a museum and can be inspected. As already mentioned: Quite curious!

The Hardap Reservoir is close to Mariental. The Reservoir isn't just carrying the Fish River's water, but serves the natives and vacationists as popular recreational area. Excellent water sports and hinge possibilities. Ideal for a cooling.

Central Namibia

Windhoek: Namibia's Capital has approx. 250.000 inhabitants. Windhoek's urban features containing architectural contrast of historical colonial buildings and progressive glass palaces as they are to be found in every large metropole today. Nevertheless: Windhoek is unique !

The multicultural capital life is best compared with a colorful patchwork. Windhoek offers everything, has everything, knows everything: Shopping & strolling, street cafés, accommodations and hotels of each price range, parks, restaurant, beer gardens, bars, arts and crafts souvernirs and - not to forget! – sights: among others Ink Palace, Christ Church, Rider- and Kudude-Monument - etc..

A must: Try the delicious game specialties in one of the numerous restaurants; *the* culinary Highlight.

Okahandja: The Hereros' headquarter. Every year the Herero's procession is held in Okahandja. In addition, the wood carver market is the souvenir-eldorado for small beautiful hand manufactured artworks.

Waterberg Plateau Park

Namibia's only mountain park can be discovered on several signposted walks. The "Mountain-View-Walk" is recommended. Hikers are rewarded with a unique view. Of course game drives are offered as well. Many rare species are residents of the park, among others the Black Rhinoceros for instance. And visitors find an unbelievable bird world here again, too.

But history of the park is unfortunately less impressive. During the battle at the Waterberg, thousands of Hereros were killed, because German colonial troops forced the Hereros to escape right in the desert, where most of them died of thirst.

Caprivi

Green and fertile. As narrow stripe the northeastern region reaches up to the Victoria Falls. Caprivi's national parks Mahango, Mudumu and Mamili houses gigantic elephants and buffalo herds, crocodiles as well as several beasts of prey. Not to forget: the impressive bird world. Colored and sometimes restful loud!

Tours **Namibia "Highlights"**

Day 1

Departure to Waterberg Plateau Park; walk, inspection, overnight stay with breakfast in the state camp.

Day 2

Drive to Etoscha via Tsumeb, Hoba Meteorite, Otjikoto sea (depending on time). Visit of a very beautiful museum with relicts from the colonial times and minerals of the copper mine (optionally). Arrival in Fort Namutoni. At Namutoni - depending on time - a short game drive. Overnight stay and breakfast.

Day 3

To Camp Okaukuejo, swimming opportunity. In the afternoon game drive. In the evening opportunity to watch animals at the water hole (floodlight). Overnight stay and breakfast in the camp.

Day 4

Direction Damaraland, the famous bushman region, via Twyfelfontein to the "Burned Mountain" and to the "Petrified Woods". Overnight stay incl. dinner and breakfast at a lodge near Khorixas.

Day 5

Drive to Terrace Bay. Passing through the Namib Desert, to skeleton coast along the atlantic ocean. Sundowner. Overnight stay and breakfast at Terrace Bay State Camp (depending on availability; optionally a guest farm in the Damaraland)

Day 6

Drive along the skeleton coast throughout fantastic and untouched landscape. Visit of Cape Cross, the world's largest seal colony. In the evening arrival in Swakopmund. Overnight stay at ORANGE House B 'n B.

Day 7

Swakopmund. Visit of a museum (very interesting), shopping, beach, sightseeing tour. Overnight stay at ORANGE House B 'n B.

Day 8

Namib-Naukluft park along the magnificent lunar landscape, inspection of the Welwitschia Mirabilis. Overnight stay, breakfast on a guest farm at Solitaire.

Day 9

Via Sesriem Canyon to Sossusvlei, the biggest dune landscapes of the world. Overnight stay with breakfast in a desert lodge or a guest farm at Helmeringhausen.

Day 10

Through the Namib Desert via Aus to Lüderitz Bay. Visit of the deserted ghost town Kolmanskoppe (optional), overnight stay and breakfast in the hotel.

Day 11

Journey via Aus and Seeheim to Fish River Canyon, the 2nd greatest Canyon of the world. Overnight stay and breakfast in a guest lodge.

Day 12

Stay at the Canyon with Canyon inspection and/or excursions etc..

Day 13

Passing through southern Namibia in northwestern direction via Keetmanshoop – incl. visit of the famous Quiver Tree Woods - to Mariental. Overnight stay at the Hardap Dam, game drive, breakfast on a guest farm or in the state camp.

Day 14

Via Windhoek return to OKAMBARA

Tour can be shortened down to 13 days, if, for instance, day 5 at Terrace Bay is left out. Tour is offered also in reversed order.

Caprivi/Vic Falls/Etoscha

Day 1

Departure to Waterberg Plateau Park. Tour at the Plateau with game drives/walks. Overnight stay with breakfast in the state camp or guest farm.

Day 2

Departure to Rundu. Overnight stay with breakfast on a guest lodge at the Okavango River

Day 3

Drive to Katima Mulilo in the eastern Caprivi. Overnight stay and breakfast at Zambesi River Lodge.

Day 4

Heading to Victoria Falls. Traditional tribal-dance demonstration (optional), tour to the falls (optional), sundowner-cruise on the Zambesi (optional). Overnight stay, breakfast in a lodge or hotel.

Day 5

Victoria Falls, shopping, white water rafting, bungee jumping etc. (activities optional); overnight stay/breakfast in a lodge or hotel.

Day 6

To Liansulu Lodge, located in the eastern Caprivi (Mudumu national park), motorboat and/or mokoro cruise, nature walks, bird world, game drives (watch elephants and hippos). Overnight stay, dinner and breakfast.

Day 7

Liansulu Lodge (see day 6).

Day 8

Passing through Caprivi Strip back to Rundu, visit of the Popa Falls. Overnight stay, breakfast in a lodge.

Day 9

From Rundu to Etosha National Park's state camp Fort Namutoni; animal observation, overnight stay/breakfast at Fort Namutoni

Day 10

And the end of the all-day safari we reach Camp Halali in the afternoon. Swimming opportunity, watch animals in the afternoon as well as at night at the waterhole. Overnight stay/breakfast at Camp Halali.

Day 11

Throughout Etosha towards Camp Okaukuejo. Animal observation (rhinos, elephants etc.;

Day 12

Via Outjo, Okahandja (visit of the wood carver market) and Windhoek return to OKAMBARA Game Ranch.

Kaokoveld

Day 1

Direction Kamanjab, via Windhoek, Okahandja, Otjiwarongo and Outjo. Overnight stay incl. breakfast on a guest farm.

Day 2

Early in the morning in northern direction to Ruacana at the Kunene. Camp at the river shore. Preparation of open air dinner at the fireplace.

Day 3

Drive on along Kunene. Tent camp.

Day 4

Direction to Epupa Falls. Possibility to visit the Himba. Walks and bath in the Kunene. Tent camp.

Day 5

To Otjitanda, the inland region through deep ravines and over high mountains. The stage is accomplished in the afternoon, construction of the tent camp and enjoy the silence.

Day 6

The most difficult stage via famous Van Zyls Pass is still to come. First of all passing the Marienflußtal with his infinite distances in direction to the border of Angola. Tent camp at the Kunene River Shore.

Day 7

After a fortifying breakfast and a last bath in the Kunene we're heading to the south along the Hartmann Mountains to Orupembe. In the the afternoon construction of the tent camp.

Day 8

After the bush breakfast, passing trough southern Kaokoveld to Purros. We pass through endless landscapes with Ovahimba settlements and with a little luck, we might have the chance to take a look on the last desert elephants. Overnight stay in the tent camp.

Day 9

In eastern direction via Fort Sesfontein to Hobatere at the edge of the Etoscha National Park. Overnight stay in the camp.

Day 10

Entering Etoscha National Park. Game drive to Camp Okaukuejo, swimming opportunity, game drive, watch animals in the evening (floodlight).

Day 11

Etoscha: Game Drive, animal observation (rhinos, elephants etc.), swimming. Overnight stay at Camp Halali.

Day 12

Safari throuout Etosha toward our third camp, Fort Namutoni. Animal observation (see day 11).

Day 13

Game drive, walk, animal observation. From Namutoni via Tsumeb (Hoba meteorite, Lake Otjikoto) to, if required, Waterberg Plateau Park.

Day 14

Via Okahandja (wood carver market, ostrich farm) and Windhoek return to the OKAMBARA Elephant Lodge.

Etoscha

Day 1

Via Waterberg and Tsumeb to Etosha. Lunchbreak on the road. In the afternoon arrival at Fort Namutoni. Depending on time, a short game drive, dinner. Overnight stay, breakfast.

Day 2

Game Drive throughout Etosah to Camp Halali. In the afternoon arrival at the rest camp. Swimming opportunity. In the evening animal observation at the water hole (floodlight). Dinner, overnight stay, breakfast at Camp Halali.

Day 3

Game drive to Cam Okaukuejo. Swimming, animal observation (rhinoceri, elephants etc.; see day 2).

Day 4

Via Outjo and Okahandja return to Okambara.

Tour can be extended up to 5 days, if, for instance, an overnight stay at Waterberg Plateau Park is included at day 1. Tour is offered in reversed order as well.

Namibia south

Day 1

Via Windhoek through Khomas Highlands to Namib Naukluft park. Overnight stay with dinner and breakfast in a desert lodge or a guest farm at Solitaire.

Day 2

Along Sesriem Canyon to Sossusvlei, the worlds biggest dune landscape. Dinner, overnight stay and breakfast on a guest farm at Helmeringhausen.

Day 3

Passing through the Namib Desert to Fish River Canyon, the second largest canyon of the world. In between: Stops for photos etc.. Dinners, overnight stay and breakfast.

Day 4

Fish River Canyon. Canyon excursion (if possible), game drive. Dinner, overnight stay and breakfast on a guest farm.

Day 5

Via Keetmanshoop in northwestern direction to Mariental. Overnight stay at Hardap Reservoir, game drive. Overnight stay, dinner and breakfast on a guest farm.

Day 6

Via Windhoek return to OKAMBARA.

Fly-In safari Victoria Falls and Chobe

Day 1

Flight Windhoek - Vic Falls, transfer to Victoria Falls hotel, traditional tribal-dance demonstration. Dinner, overnight stay.

Day 2

Victoria Falls sightseeing, path to the waterfalls, in the evening boat trip on the Zambesi. Possibility to visit an african museum village or a crocodile farm. Dinner, overnight stay.

Day 3

In the morning transfer to Chobe Game Lodge in Botswana. Safari, boat trip, dinner, overnight stay.

Day 4

Game Drive at Chobe national park, dinner, overnight stay.

Day 5

In the morning transfer to Victoria Falls Airport, return flight to Windhoek.

Tour can be shortened down to 3 days, if Botswana/Chobe Transfer on day 3 is left out and instead return flight to Windhoek is preferred.

Namibia short**Day 1**

To Waterberg Plateau Park. Tour at the plateau with animal observation (depending on time, otherwise on day 2), walks, inspections. Overnight stay, breakfast in the state camp.

Day 2

Via Tsumeb to Etosha National Park. Lunch break on the road. Optionally, museum-visit with relics from the colonial times and minerals of the copper mine. In the afternoon arrival at Etosha's state camp Fort Namutoni, perhaps a short game drive. Dinner, overnight stay, breakfast.

Day 3

Game drive throughout Etosha to Camp Halali. In the afternoon arrival at the rest camp. Swimming opportunity. Game Drive in the afternoon. In the evening watch animals at the water hole (floodlight). Overnight stay with breakfast.

Day 4

Etosha: Safari to Camp Okaukuejo. Animal observation (rhinoceri, elephants etc.; see day 3), swimming.

Day 5

Departure to Damaraland/Khorixas. Visit of the famous rockpaintings at Twyfelfontein, the "Burned Mountain" and the "Petrified Woods". Overnight stay, dinner and breakfast on a guest farm.

Day 6

To Swakopmund. Dinner at a restaurant. Overnight stay with breakfast at ORANGE House B 'n B.

Day 7

Swakopmund: Museum, beach, sightseeing-tour, shopping, golf, quadbiking, sand-boarding, sky diving etc.. Overnight stay at ORANGE House B 'n B.

Day 8

Via Windhoek back to OKAMBARA.

OKAMBARA – Swakopmund - OKAMBARA

Actually, this journey isn't a tour in a common sense, which generally covers a stage per day. To experience the contrast between the original south-african wilderness on OKAMBARA and the cozy town life in one of the most popular vacation resorts of the southern Africa, Swakopmund, is this tour's intention.

Your accommodation in Swakopmund:

ORANGE House, the pleasant Bed ' n Breakfast, which is run by the Schmitt family.

Day 1: Transfer/OKAMBARA

Transfer Hosea Kutako Airport Windhoek - OKAMBARA. Lunch. midday-rest. Game drive. Watch elephants, rhinos, giraffes, antelopes etc. Dinner at the OKAMBARA Fort.

Day 2: OKAMBARA

Breakfast. Game drive. Lunch. Midday-rest. Relax on the terrace or at the pool. In the evening Braai.

Day 3: OKAMBARA

Breakfast. Lunch. Midday-rest. sundowner game drive. Dinner.

Day 4: Transfer OKAMBARA-Windhoek-Swakopmund

Breakfast. Transfer via Windhoek to Swakopmund. In Windhoek: Sightseeing tour & lunch. In the late afternoon arrival at Orange House. Check-in. Dinner at the Brauhaus, Swakopmund's most famous restaurant.

Day 5: Swakopmund

Breakfast at ORANGE House. Shopping, beach walks, sun downer at the "mole". Lunch and dinner in a restaurant in Swakopmund.

Day 6: Swakopmund

Breakfast at Orange House. Optionally, all-day or short scenic-flight along the coast or over the Namib desert. Or: Golf on the Rossmunds Golf Club 18 hole course. Dinner in a restaurant in Swakopmund.

Day 7: Swakopmund

Breakfast at ORANGE House. You can retire for example for a sunbath on the ORANGE House rooftop terrace. If you prefer a little more action, ride the dunes of swakop by quad-bike or sandboard. Dinner in a restaurant in Swakopmund.

Day 8: Transfer: Swakopmund/Okahandja/Windhoek/OKAMBARA

Breakfast at ORANGE House. Return trip to OKAMBARA via Okahandja (wood carver market). Lunch in Windhoek. Shopping in Windhoek's City Center. Dinner at OKAMBARA.

Day 9 OKAMBARA

Breakfast. Morning at free disposal. Lunch. Midday-rest. Coffee & cake. Cheetah feeding. Dinner.

Day 10 OKAMBARA

Breakfast. Game drive. Lunch. Midday-rest. Coffee & cake. Afternoon at free disposal. Dinner.
